ARRIVE SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 13

After a long day of travel, enjoy a restful evening at the beautiful Divani Palace Hotel in Athens.

MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 14

After breakfast, we begin with an orientation before visiting the Acropolis and the Areopagus, where Paul addressed Greek philosophers about the "unknown God" (Acts 17:23). In the afternoon, enjoy a wine and food tasting tour of Athens.

TUESDAY. SEPTEMBER 15

Fly to Kavala and tour the ancient city of Philippi. See the prison where Paul and Silas were incarcerated and where God caused an earthquake to free them (Acts 16:27). It was in Philippi where Lydia, the first Christian convert in Europe came to faith (Acts 16:15).

WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 16

Today we tour the city of Thessaloniki. Paul's letter to the Thessalonians was probably the earliest of his letters. It was here where Paul was accused of "turning the world upside down" because of his message of Christ crucified (Acts 17:6).

THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 17

In Berea (modern Veria), Paul found a receptive audience who received his message "with all eagerness" (Acts 17:11). At the site of his preaching stands St. Paul's Tribune, a striking marble and mosaic monument. We then continue to the Meteora Monasteries, 14th–15th century sanctuaries dramatically perched atop towering sandstone pinnacles, seeming to float in the air.

FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 18

Today, we tour Delphi. The Greeks believed that this was the center of the universe. Delphi is renowned for its architectural remains, including the Temple of Apollo, the theater, the stadium and treasuries dedicated to the gods.

SATURDAY. SEPTEMBER 19

We begin in Corinth, where Paul spent 18 months preaching and establishing a church to which he wrote four letters (two preserved). Highlights include the Archaeological Museum, the marketplace, and the ruins where Paul once stood. The day concludes in Athens with a joyful Farewell Supper at Café Avissinia's rooftop.

SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 20

Depart for home with cherished memories, a fresh understanding of the Bible and a renewed faith. This trip is more than travel. It is a spiritual experience that will stay with you for a lifetime.
